

About Watershed Plans: Watershed or current work plans are an important component of any successful watershed effort. Since there is no standard format for a watershed plan, each group must write a plan that meets its needs and personality. Dynamic plans should be reviewed and revised regularly. Plans are usually written from the general to the specific, often in the form of goals/objectives/tasks.

A couple of good tests for your plan are:

- Can someone from outside your group read your plan understand what you are about and where you are headed; and
- if you have a change in coordinators or group members, will the plan give them

For the purposes of the WPAG, please be as specific as possible. Information should be both qualitative and quantitative depending on the objective or task. It should answer the questions such as who, when, how many, etc. Wherever possible quantify the expected results by providing numbers, such as number of meetings or workshops that will be conducted. For process related items describe the process and the expected outcome.
