

Is the Endangered Species Act a Weapon in the War on the West?

n August 28, 2013 CBU received an invitation from the U.S. House Committee on Natural Resources Chairman, Doc Hastings, to testify at a congressional field hearing in Billings. The hearing was scheduled for September 4th. This was a great honor for us to participate in a formal hearing on "State and Local Efforts to Protect Species, Jobs, Property, and Multiple Use Amidst a New War on the West."
