

NOTICE OF SALE

Department of Natural Resources & Conservation Timber Sale

The Lion Point Timber Sale is located within Sections 16 & 30, T14N-R24W and Sections 24, 26, & 36, T14N-R25W on the State's Missoula Unit. Approximately 23,586 tons, consisting of mixed conifers, primarily Douglas-fir sawlogs, are offered for sale.

Sealed bids will be opened at the Department of Natural Resources & Conservation, 2705 Spurgin Road, Missoula, Montana on **July 9, 2026 at 2:00 p.m.** Bids may be hand delivered or mailed and will be accepted any time prior to the bid opening. DNRC recommends that bidders contact the Trust Land Management Division (406-542-4300) prior to the bid opening to ensure that your bid has been received. **Bids must be accompanied by a deposit of \$3,084.00**, representing 5% of the minimum bid value of the sale in cashier's check, certified check, bank money order or bank draft to be applied to the first sale invoice for the successful bidder. Bid bonds will be accepted and, for the successful bidder, will be closed upon execution of the Timber Sale Contract and Timber Sale Bond.

The sale will be awarded to the highest responsible bidder. If the successful bidder is unable to execute the contract within **30** calendar days from the date the sale is awarded, the bid deposit will be retained by the Department as liquidated damages. The right is reserved to reject any or all bids.

General Bidding Information

1. Bids must be submitted on Department of Natural Resources & Conservation (State) bid forms.
2. Timber will be sold to the highest responsible bidder; however, the State reserves the right to reject any or all bids.
3. The State recommends that bidders contact the Forest Management Bureau, Trust Land Management Division (406-542-4300) prior to the bid opening to ensure that your bid has been received.
4. A **Bid Deposit** must accompany all bids and must be in the form of cash, cashiers check, certified check, money order, bank draft, surety bond or irrevocable letter of credit.
5. The Purchaser must submit a **Performance Bond** to the State within 30 days of notification of sale award. The bond amount will be, at a minimum, 20% of the total bid value of the sale. The performance bond may be cash, irrevocable letter of credit, surety bond or certificate of deposit. The performance bond must be maintained separately from other payments for the duration of the Timber Sale Contract. See the Timber Sale Contract for additional information.
6. The purchaser must submit an **Advance Stumpage Payment** prior to cutting any timber. The amount of the advance stumpage payment will cover six weeks of harvesting and be based on the expected harvest rate and the bid value of the stumpage. The advance stumpage payment may be cash, irrevocable letter of credit, payment bond or certificate of deposit.
7. At rates specified in the Contract, the purchaser will pay **Forest Improvement Fees** on all sawlog volume. All applicable **Road Use and/or Maintenance fees** will also be paid by the Purchaser in addition to stumpage payments.
8. This sale is being sold based on the gross weight of all species. Minimum price and bid price are on a per ton basis. Unless otherwise specified, the price applies to all species, green and dead. Price may vary by product. Billing will be based on gross weight. A weight ticket from a certified scale is required for each load hauled, regardless of product type.
9. The State has estimated the net scale merchantable sawlog volume to be sold under this Contract. Other products may be part of this sale. All delivered wood will be weighed and billed at per ton bid rates. The State recognizes that a percentage of delivered wood may not meet the log manufacturing and recovery standards of the Timber Sale Contract. The actual percentage will vary based on the log manufacturing and recovery specifications of the purchaser and tree conditions in the sale area. The actual delivered weight may vary, resulting in an overrun or under-run of the estimated tonnage. The State strongly recommends that bidders evaluate these effects before bidding.
10. The State does not conduct detailed road appraisals. All appraised costs are gross estimates or averages, provided only to show the relative amount of work required, and not the true market value. The State strongly recommends that bidders make their own estimates based on Contract requirements. Cost estimates provided are not guaranteed.
11. Bidders are encouraged to examine the complete Timber Sale Package and Sale Area prior to bidding. Additional information is available at the phone numbers shown above.
12. Estimates for sale volume, species percents, defect, product class, etc. provided in this prospectus and volume estimates listed in the Timber Sale Contract are not guaranteed.
13. This prospectus is provided for information purposes only. If the prospectus is in error or contradicts the Timber Sale Contract, the Contract governs.

Additional Sale Information:

- **Bidders are encouraged to set up a meeting (not required) with DNRC Forester Sam Whitney 406-207-1235 for a tour of the sale. Due to old, grown in roads, UTV, ATV or snowmobiles are encouraged to see all the harvest units and roads.**
- **Combo lock is 3672 (DNRC).**
- Ponderosa pine sawlog price is set at \$1.00/ton. Bid price should reflect sawlogs from all other included species.
- **ALTERNATE YARDING SYSTEMS MAY BE APPROVED:** The Forest Officer may approve alternative yarding methods besides those specified for each sale unit. An alternative system proposed by the Purchaser must be approved by the Forest Officer at or before the time the Logging Operations Plan for the unit is approved. The Forest Officer will only approve alternatives that are consistent with planned mitigation and resource protection measures. Alternatives may include tethered equipment or other systems. Costs of alternative systems will be borne by the Purchaser.
- The Purchaser shall be responsible for 1 (one) application of Tordon, 2- 4- D and Escort on approximately 16.62 miles road. (50 total acres) spot spraying existing knapweed, houndstongue, St. Johnwort, thistle, mullein, and sulphur cinquefoil on Roads: Ruben, Point B, Lookout, Bench, Park B, South, Gate, Grass and Lower Grass. The application shall be completed after harvest and prior to **July 15, 2030**. Herbicide application shall only occur between May 15 through July 15. Road spray width shall be 25 feet. Any changes to the herbicides used must be approved by the Forest Officer.
- Units 1602, 3601, 3602 and 3605: All unhealthy trees with poor crowns, greater than 7" DBH but not meeting sawlog recovery standards, and that are not designated to leave, will be cut and then using a combination of: cut into a pulp log, skidded to a landing pile or slashed in the unit. Scattered clumps of greater than 7" DBH trees can be left in the unit as wildlife habitat, this needs to be approved by the Forest Officer and usually will be under a half acre.
- Water truck may be required for dust abatement during hauling on USFS 343 Road during dusty conditions (requirement of USFS TRUP).
- Road distances were measured in miles with either an odometer or GPS.
- Non-sawlog material, including pulp and firewood are optional to haul at \$1.00/ton.
- Forest Improvement (FI) Fees will be billed concurrently with stumpage rather than quarterly. See Section II.B. of Contract.
- Optional roads would be at the expense of the purchaser. No stumpage or financial credit will be given if the purchaser and forest officer agree to not construct listed optional roads.
- **Changes in this re-bid offering:**
 - **Dates extended for road work, harvest, weed spraying, and contract termination.**
 - **Harvest Units 3001 and 3002 are now optional. The associated road work has also become optional with the work on the roads accessing these units required only if these units are harvested.**
 - **All changes are highlighted yellow.**

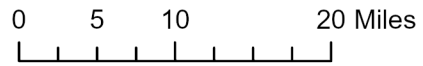
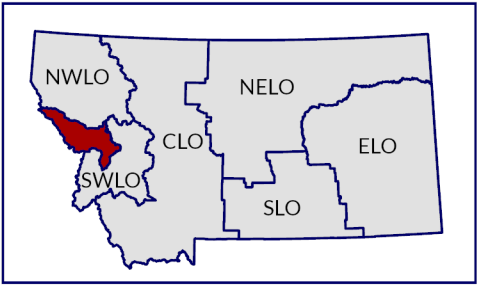

State Trust Land Vicinity Map **Missoula Unit**

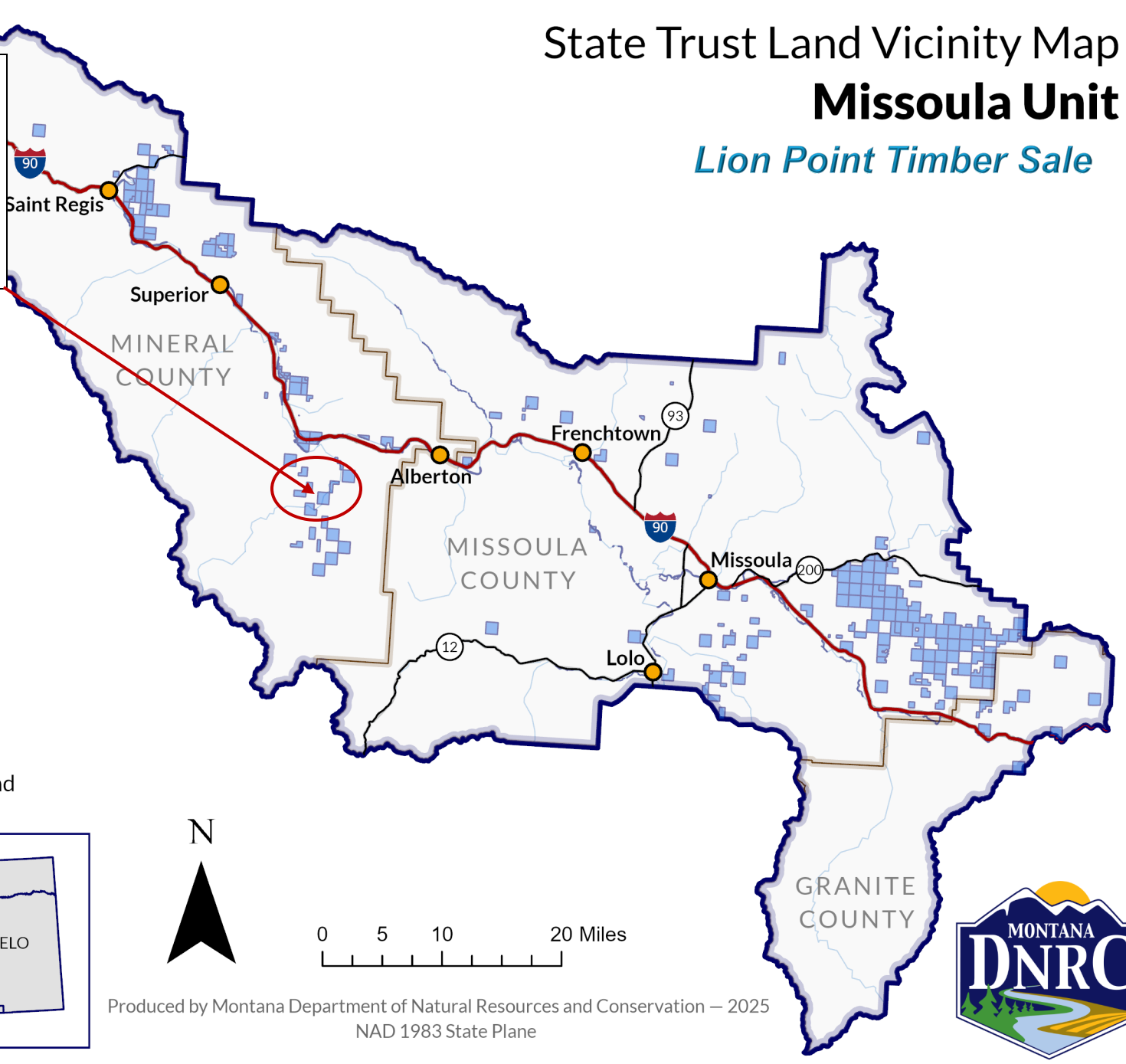

Lion Point Timber Sale Haul Route

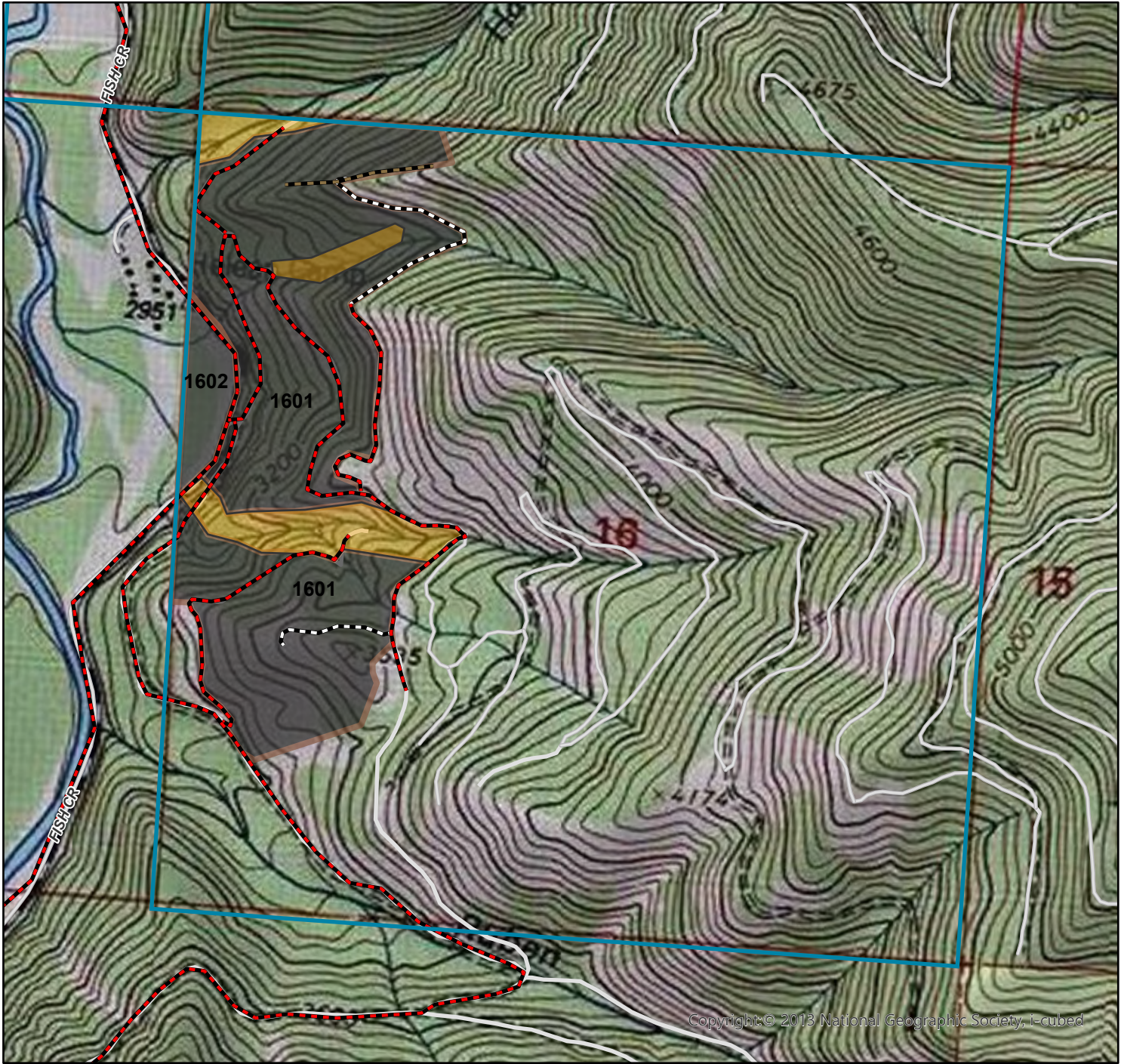

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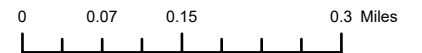
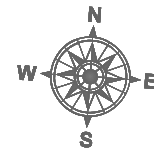
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Lion Point Timber Sale Section 26 T14N R25W Attachment 2d



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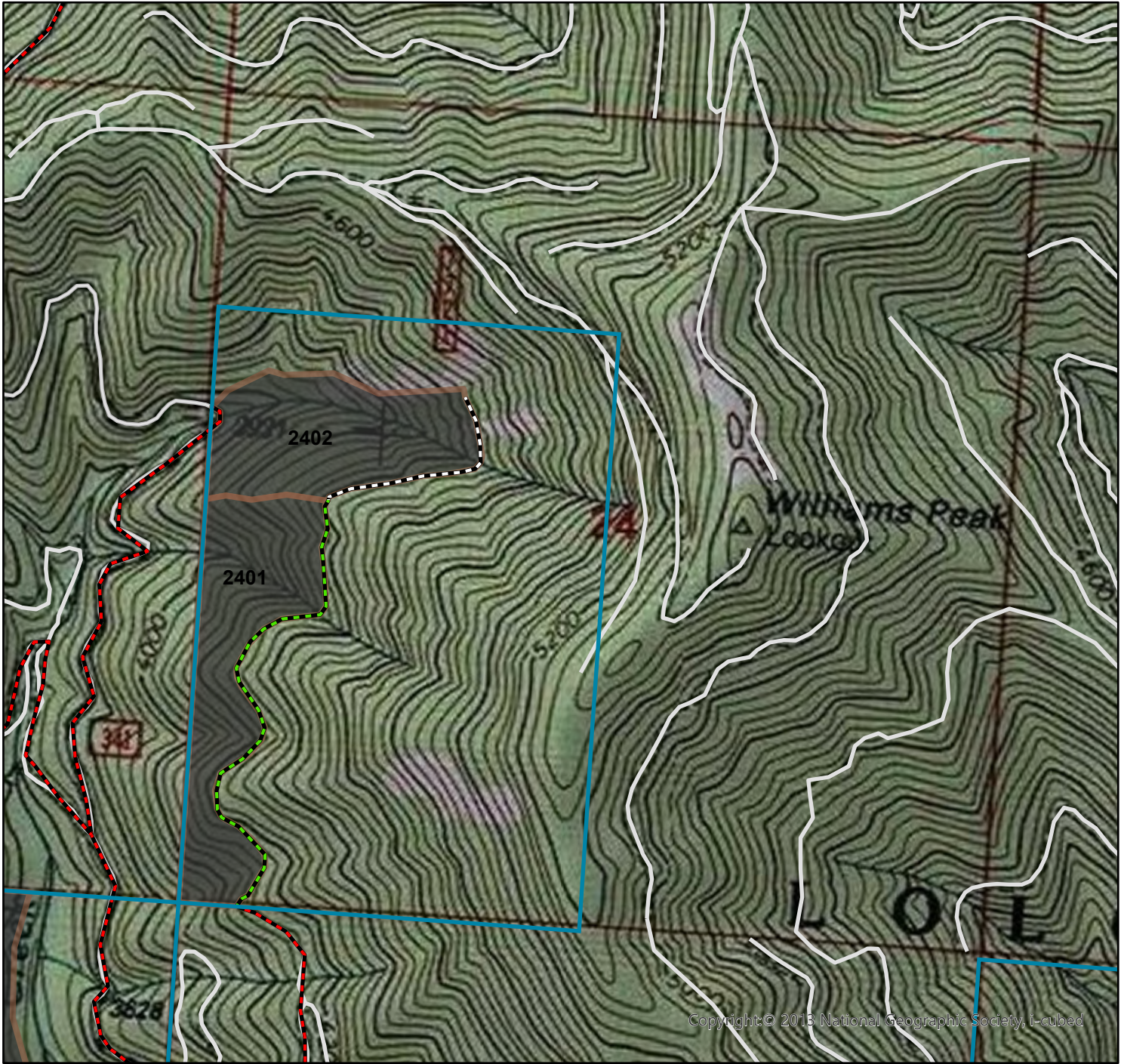

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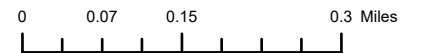
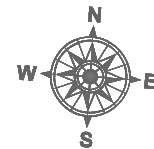
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Lion Point Timber Sale Section 24 T14N R25W Attachment 2e



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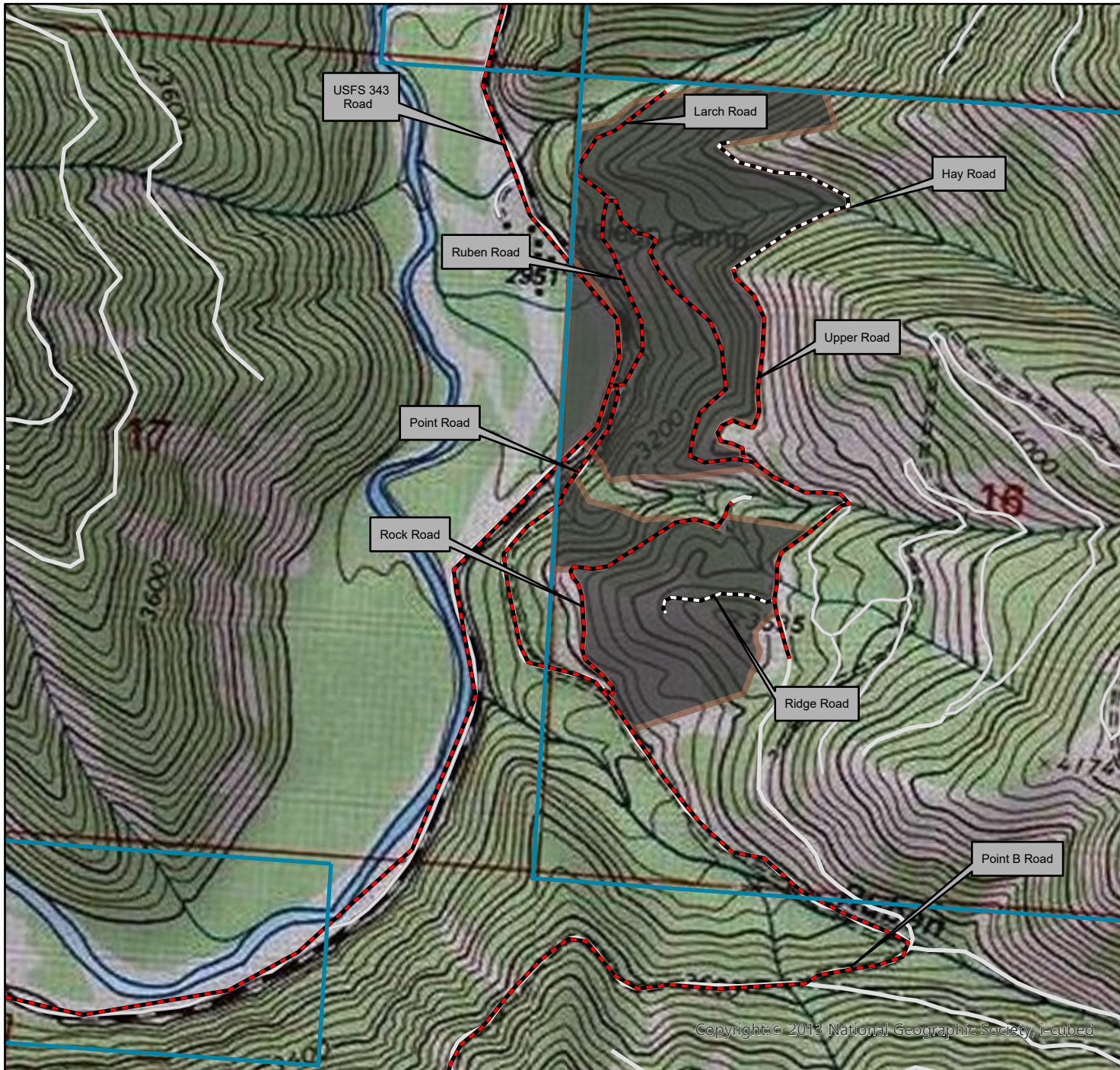

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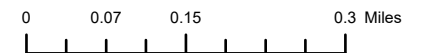
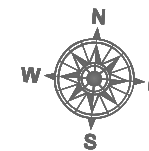
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Lion Point Timber Sale Section 16 T14N R24W Attachment 3a



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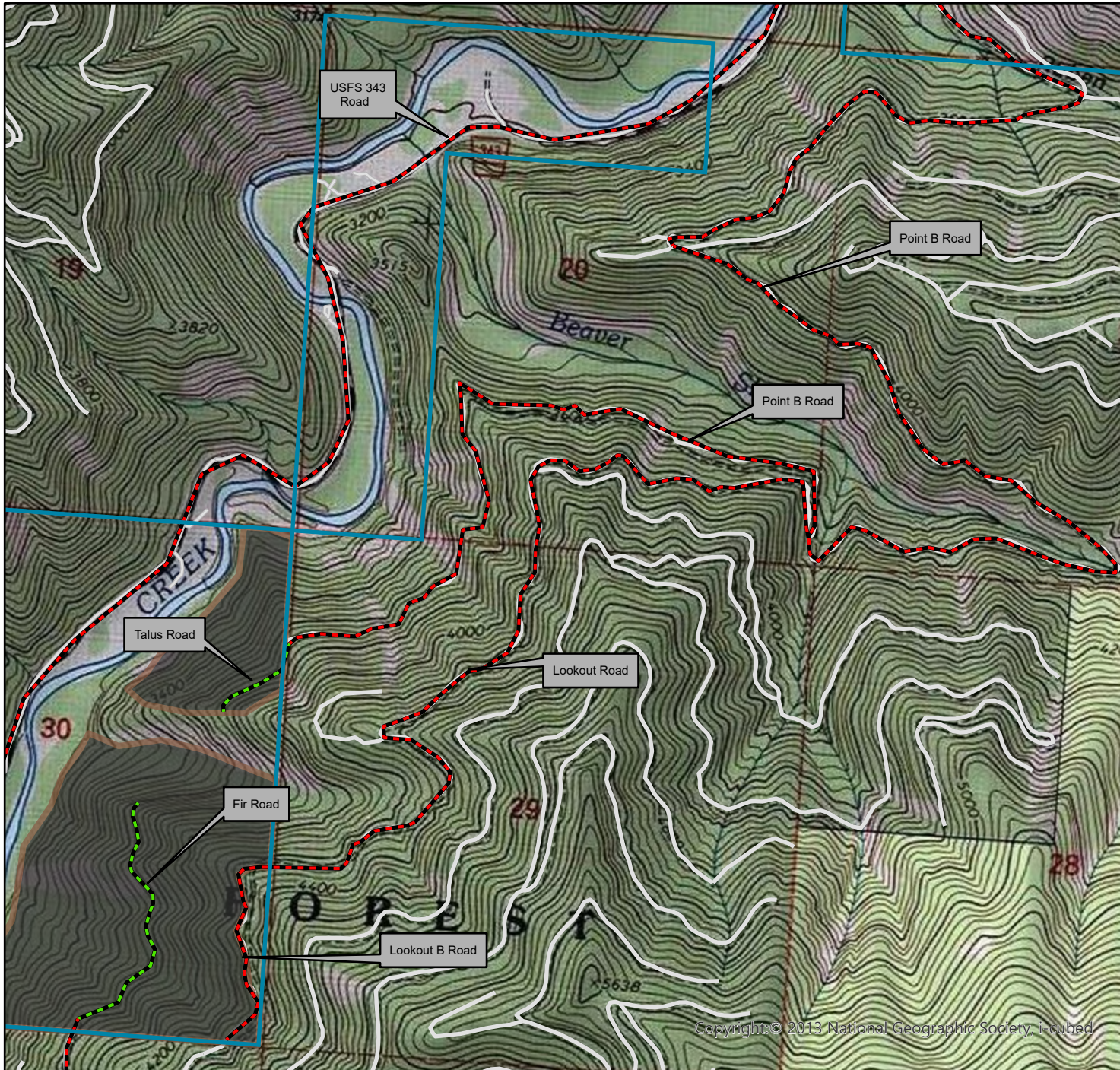

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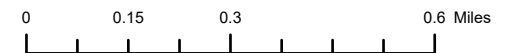
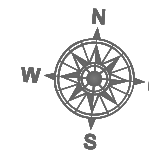
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Lion Point Timber Sale Section 24,26 T14N R25W Attachment 3d
