

Types of Natural Resource Grants An overview of funding sources in Montana

Future Fisheries Improvement Program

- Projects that enhance or restore habitats for wild fish
- Deadlines May 31, November 30 of each year
- Funding varies, typically \$200k to \$300k
- Match strongly suggested (50%+ if possible)
- Project types: fish habitat related
 riparian fencing, channel restoration, fish passage, fish screens, instream flow, + more

Community Pond Program

- Projects that improve angler access or opportunity near MT communities
- Deadline: Feb 1 each year
- Funding varies, typically \$50-75k
- Match 30%+

- Project types: habitat, access, education (fish)
 Docks/piers, habitat, aeration, trails, signage, pond deepening, pond construction, + more

Available to towns, cities, counties, conservation/irrigation/water & sewer districts. WUA's can apply
through a county or conservation district as their sponsor. Typical Emergency Projects Have Been: Canal and Dike Failures (i.e., river diversions, inlet gates, flood erosion/ice damage)
 Emergency Dam Repairs (i.e., embankment, outlet gates, spillway) Emergency Repairs to municipal drinking and wastewater systems (i.e., frozen/cracked pipes, pump/lift station repair, equipment failure) To Apply: Contact Grant Manager. Sponsor will receive a letter acknowledging the request for funds and requesting information to initiate the process.

Project Categories

Mineral Development Projects: Projects that repair, reclaim or mitigate environmental damage to natural resources from mining, oil and gas development, and hazardous waste

Crucial state need projects develop, promote, or protect Montana's total environment and the general health, safety, welfare, and public resources of Montana's citizens and communities. Projects must have regional or statewide importance to natural resources.
