

- Started in 1979 as part of the Rangeland Resource Program,
- Low-interest loans to Montana's farmers and ranchers for rangeland improvements and development,
- An incentive for private landowners to undertake range improvement practices and projects,
- Loan applicant applies initially to the local conservation district where only the conservation plan is reviewed,
- Loan application is then reviewed by the Montana Department of Natural Resources and Conservation (DNRC).
- If approved by the director of DNRC and the Rangeland Resource Committee, the loan is dispersed.



- Current interest rate = 3.5%
- Max. loan amount = \$100,000
- Repayment Term = 10 years
- Annual installments

Eligibilities:

- Must be a private landowner
- Example projects include: stock water developments (tanks), implementation of grazing methods/program, reseeding, and mechanical restoration.
