# SOURCE OF SUBAWARD FUNDS

A FEDERAL AGENCY is allocated funds by Congress and awards grants to Recipients.



#### A **RECIPIENT**


receives a grant and passes through funds to a Subrecipient.



#### A SUBRECIPIENT

receives a subaward and completes a project.

#### In this case ...



Note that DNRC is also called a "pass-through entity" because it **passes federal grant dollars through** to a subrecipient.



At all three stages, funds are considered **federal**, and specific rules and laws apply. The rules "pass through," just like the funds.



Report content and timeframes are described in the subaward agreement. **SECTION 8. REPORTS**. Quarterly progress reports for the periods ending each *March, June*, September and December must be submitted to the DNRC during the term of this Subaward. Reports will provide status information for each project implementation objective. Project status information will include, at a minimum, the percentage completed, costs incurred, funds remaining, and projected completion date. Quarterly reports must be submitted to DNRC within thirty (30) calendar days following the close of the quarterly period. The first quarterly report is due on July 31, 2017.

# RESPONSIBILITY 4: COMPLETE THE PROJECT

### **PROJECT COMPLETION**

The subrecipient is required to complete the project according to the scope and scale outlined in the subaward agreement. SECTION 4. PROJECT SCOPE. (a) The Subrecipient must use the proceeds provided pursuant to this Subaward to perform allowable activities under the Program. The key outcome of the project is completion of approximately 40 fuels mitigation projects on 400 acres of private property in the project area. (b) The Program Development Project Proposal submitted by the Subrecipient attached hereto as Appendix A further describes the projects and activities to be performed by the Subrecipient and required dates of completion.


### ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

## ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS
