Subrecipients are expected to comply with all its terms.



SUBAWARD AGREEMENT VERSUS THE ORIGINAL PROJECT PROPOSAL

Note that the project scope and budget in the subaward agreement may differ from what was presented in the project proposal.

In the case of a discrepancy, the subaward agreement **supersedes** the project proposal.

UNDERSTANDING THE SUBAWARD AGREEMENT

The DNRC program manager and grant staff are available to help with understanding the terms of the subaward.

However, subrecipients may also need to consult with their own **legal or accounting staff** to help interpret some of the subaward terms and conditions and determine how best to comply with them.

SUBAWARD AMENDMENTS

When to request an amendment to a subaward agreement

THE MOST COMMON REASONS TO AMEND A SUBAWARD AGREEMENT

To extend the term of a subaward agreement:

more time is needed to finish the project.

SECTION 2. TERM. This Subaward is effective on the date of last signature. The Subrecipient shall have until January 1, 2020, to complete the project and work described in Section 4 Project Scope. The DNRC may pursuant to Section 18 Agreement Extension grant an extension for completion upon request and showing of good cause by the Subrecipient.

THE MOST COMMON REASONS TO AMEND A SUBAWARD AGREEMENT

To change the scope of the project:

A subrecipient would like to do something substantially different from what is outlined in the agreement. SECTION 4. PROJECT SCOPE. (a) The Subrecipient must use the proceeds provided pursuant to this Subaward to perform allowable activities under the Program. The key outcome of the project is completion of a public tree inventory of Green Willow Wildlife Area. (b) The Program Development Project Proposal submitted by the Subrecipient attached hereto as Appendix A describes the projects and activities to be performed by the Subrecipient and required dates of completion.

THE MOST COMMON REASONS TO AMEND A SUBAWARD AGREEMENT

To modify the subaward budget:

A significant portion of the budget must be increased, decreased, or moved to a different category. **SECTION 5. PROJECT BUDGET**. Subaward funds are allocated to the following budget categories:

CHANGING THE SUBAWARD BUDGET

Subrecipients must request DNRC approval when significant changes to the budget are anticipated.

MAJOR BUDGET ADJUSTMENTS

- Significant budget transfers require a written amendment.
- The subaward agreement describes this process and defines what constitutes a "significant" transfer — generally a percentage of the value of the agreement.

This Subaward requires a match of 2:1 of federal to non-federal funds. No federal funds may be used to satisfy the match requirement of this Subaward.

Match required will be provided by Landowners (Beneficiaries) in the form of cash contribution or in-kind services related to the project. Claimed match must be sufficiently documented to show compliance with federal requirements and to demonstrate how it supports the subaward project. DNRC will determine whether match documentation submitted is adequate and may require additional documentation before approval.

The indirect cost rate is shown above, expressed as a percentage of indirect costs to direct costs. Unless the rate has been formalized in a Negotiated Indirect Cost Rate Agreement (NICRA) between the Subrecipient and its cognizant federal agency, the rate shown above is hereby approved by DNRC for the term of this Subaward and may not be changed except via written amendment.

Subrecipient may transfer up to ten percent (10%) of the total Subaward amount between Direct Costs budget categories as needed to complete the project. The Subrecipient must notify DNRC of such transfers. Transfers between budget categories in excess of ten percent (10%) of the Subaward amount must be requested by the Subrecipient, approved by DNRC, and documented in an amendment to the Subaward.

IF A MAJOR ADJUSTMENT IS NEEDED ...

- A subrecipient should contact the DNRC program manager to begin the process of requesting and obtaining an amendment to the subaward.
- DNRC may or may not approve the changes.
- In most cases, significant changes to the spending plan must not occur until the amendment is in place.

This Amendment #2 to Subaward Agreement No. HZF-16-017, hereinafter called "Amendment #2", is made and entered into between Montana Department of Natural Resources and Conservation, Forestry Division, 2705 Spurgin Road, Missoula, MT 59804, hereinafter called "DNRC", and Green Valley Watershed, 76 Spruce Street, Green Valley, MT 59622-0912, hereinafter called the "Subrecipient". Except to the extent amended by this Amendment #2 and Amendment #1, Subaward Agreement No. HZF-16-017 remains fully in effect.

IF A MAJOR ADJUSTMENT IS NEEDED ...

- Many significant changes in spending are tied to some other significant change in the project.
- For instance, the project
 scope section in the
 subaward agreement may
 also need to be amended.

SMALLER BUDGET CHANGES


- Smaller changes to the budget may not require a formal amendment.
- However, they may still require DNRC approval.
- When in doubt, ask.

SMALLER BUDGET CHANGES: EXAMPLE I

Perhaps a subrecipient needs to slightly decrease spending on employee salaries for the project and slightly increase spending on supplies.

However, the change will not affect the accomplishment of project goals described in the subaward.

This situation **does not require** DNRC approval.



SMALLER BUDGET CHANGES: EXAMPLE 2

Perhaps a subrecipient would like to use its **entire** operating budget to purchase an irrigation system for a city park ...



rather than buy and plant trees in the park, as described in the subaward agreement.



SMALLER BUDGET CHANGES: EXAMPLE 2

- This change falls within the budget category of "Operating Expenses" and would not trigger a budget amendment.
- However, it represents a significant change to the scope of the project.
- The subrecipient needs to gain DNRC approval and possibly a subaward amendment prior to carrying out the activity.

SMALLER BUDGET CHANGES

If a subrecipient needs to buy or do something substantially different than what is described in the subaward agreement:



The first step is to **check in with the DNRC program manager** to discuss how the purchase could affect the accomplishment of project goals and whether the cost is allowable.
