1 CLAIMS FILING

- 2 State of Montana Claims. Claims arising under the jurisdiction of the State of Montana are
3 negotiated by the responsible line officer or his or her designee, who must be on the DNRC
4 Approved Signers List. For information on handling claims against the DNRC, see the 300-

- 9 State of Idaho Claims. Settlements arising under the jurisdiction of the State of Idaho must be
10 submitted in writing to the IDL host agency. The IDL host agency will submit the claim
11 documentation to the Fire Business Program Manager, Bureau of Fire Management, who may
12 settle the claim or forward it to Risk Management for final determination. Claims may also be
13 submitted in writing to the Fire Business Program Manager, Bureau of Fire Management, 3284
14 West Industrial Loop, Coeur d'Alene, ID 83815-6021; office phone: (208) 769-1525.
- 15 State of North Dakota Claims. Claims against the state must be made in writing to the Director
16 of Office of Management and Budget. The claim must be filed within 180 days of when the
17 alleged incident was discovered or reasonably should have been discovered. Claim forms may
18 be requested from the Office of Management and Budget, 600 East Boulevard Avenue,
19 Department 110, Bismarck, ND 58505-0400; phone: (701) 328-4904.
- 20 State of South Dakota Claims. Although a small portion of South Dakota is in the Northern
21 Rockies Geographic Area, the majority of the state is within the Rocky Mountain Geographic
22 Area; therefore, all South Dakota information is linked to the Rocky Mountain Incident Business
