

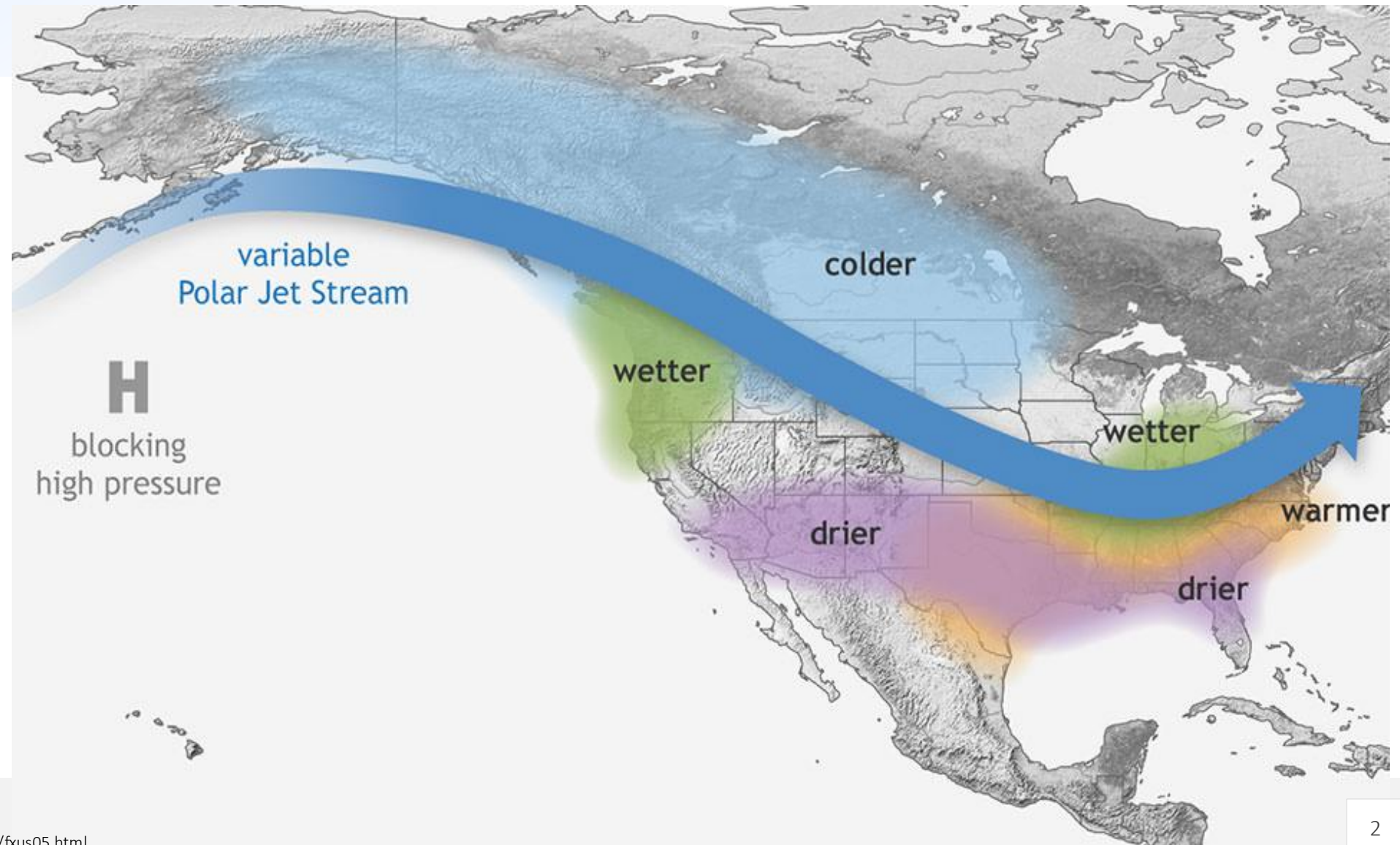

ENSO El Niño Southern Oscillation

The National Weather Service issued a **La Niña** Advisory in October.

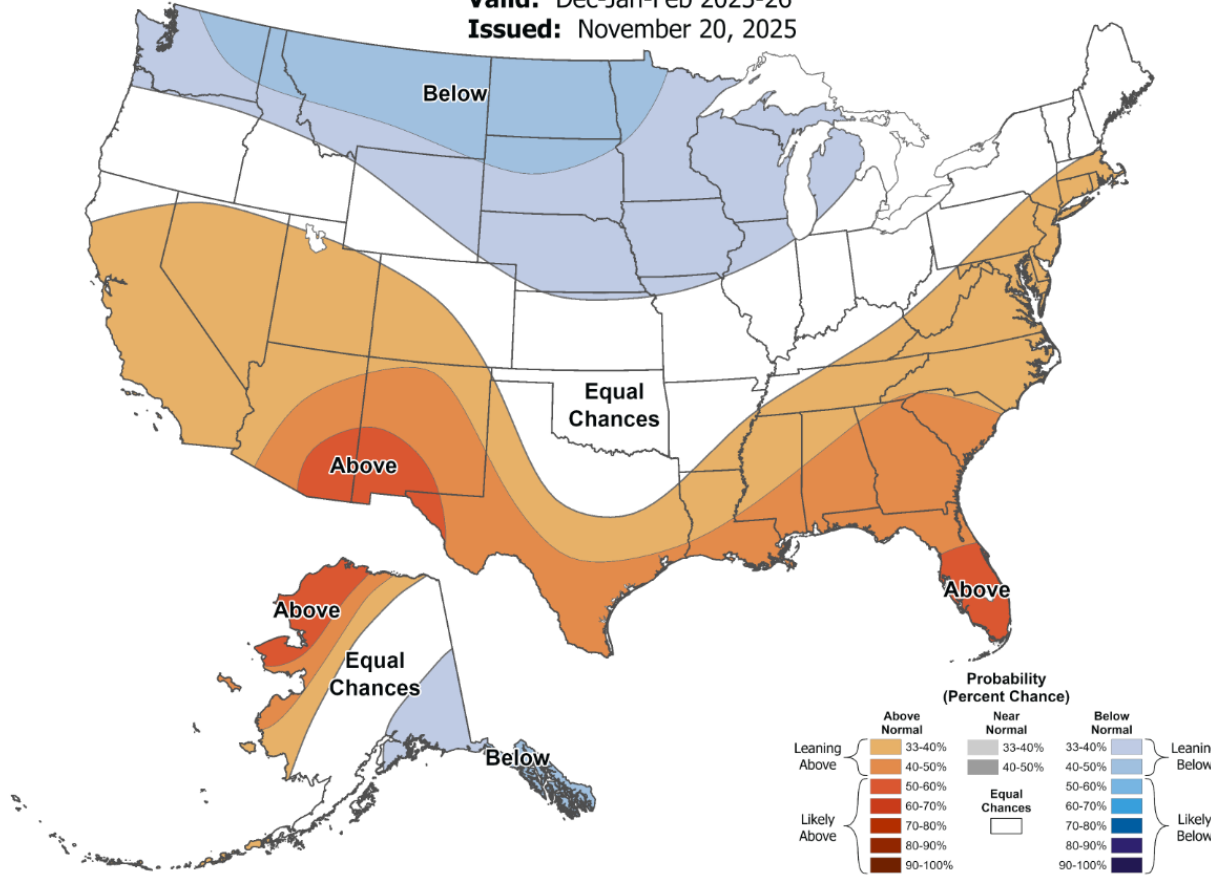
- “La Niña is favored to continue into the Northern Hemisphere winter, with a transition to ENSO-neutral most likely in January-March 2026 (61% chance).”-NOAA
- La Niña typically means a more active polar jet stream leading to a cooler and wetter than average winter for Western Montana

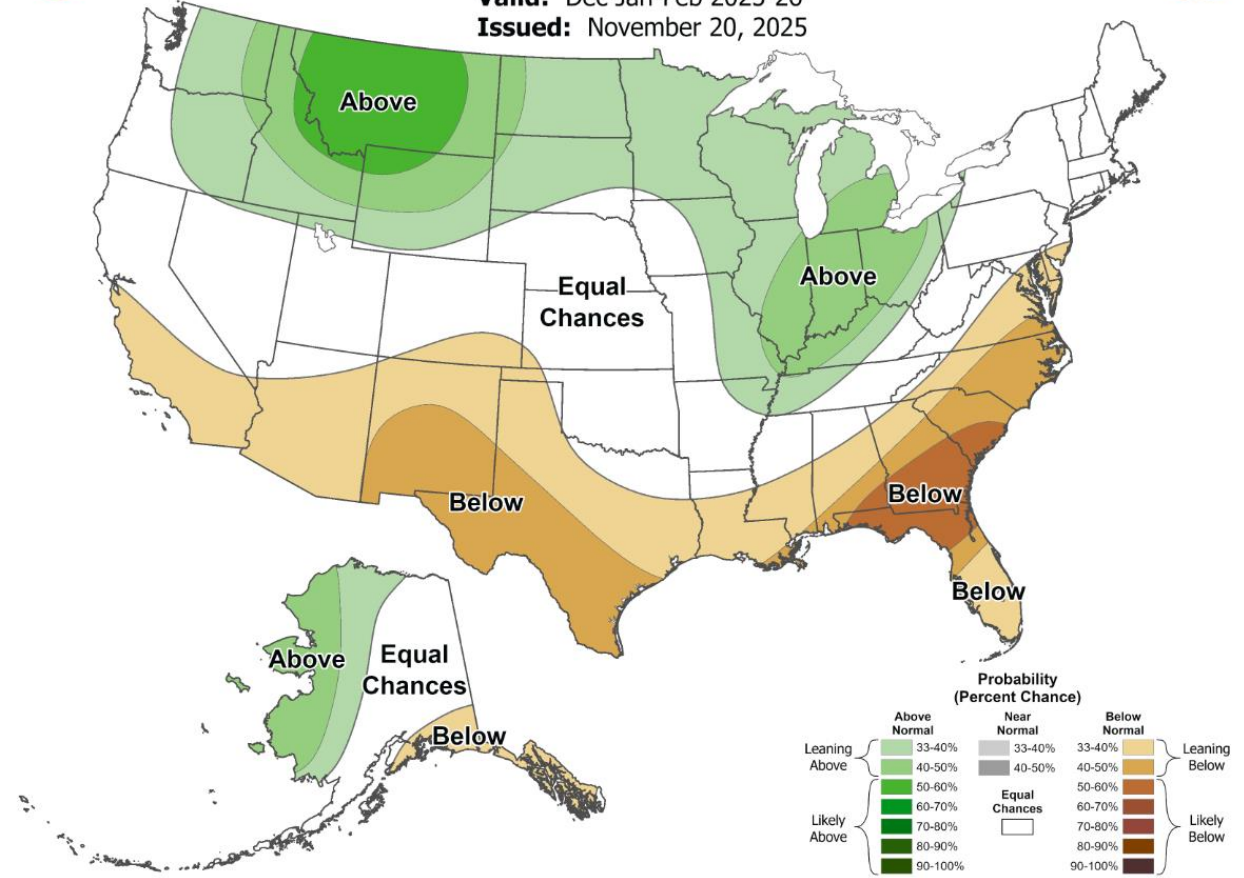

Seasonal Precipitation Outlook

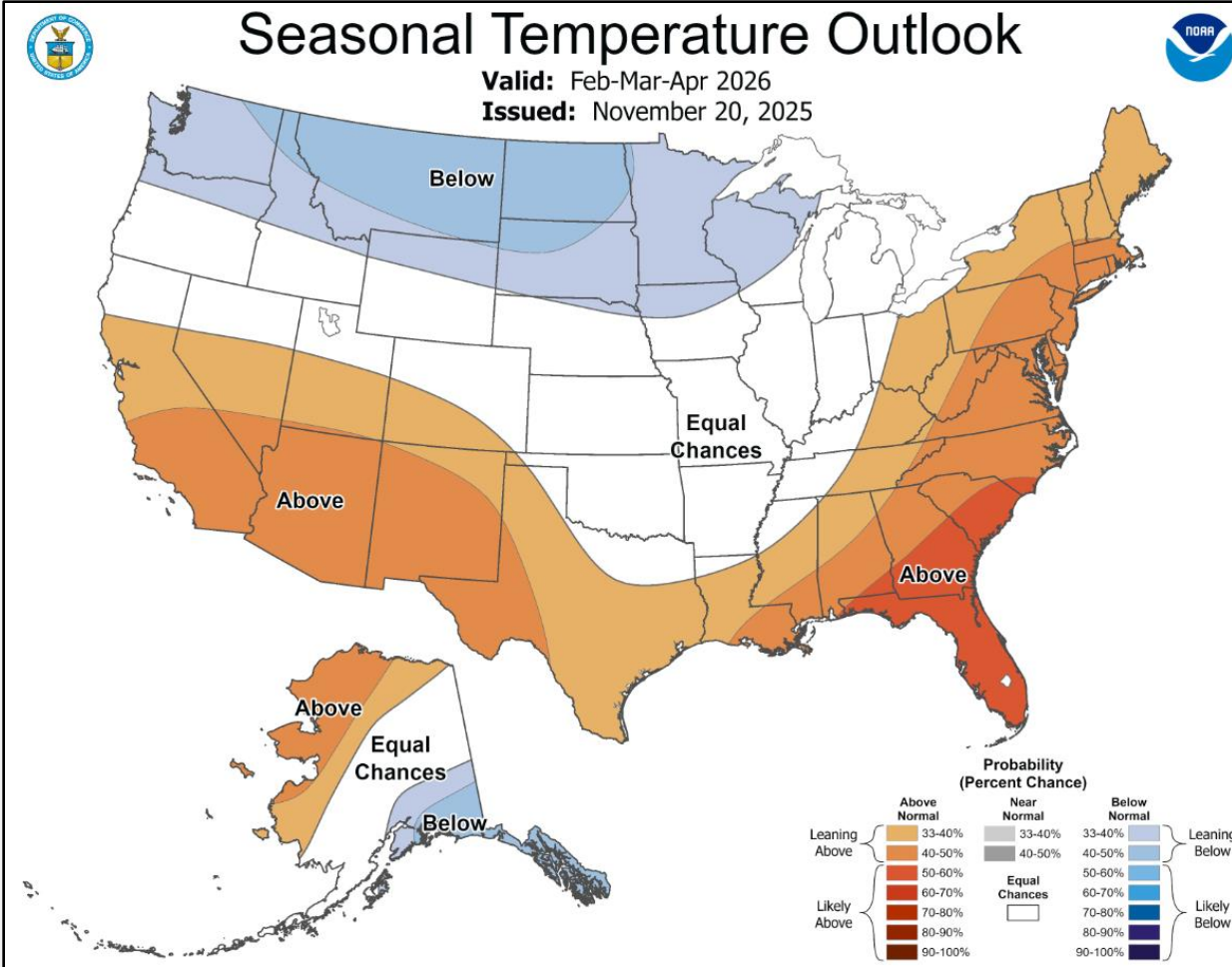

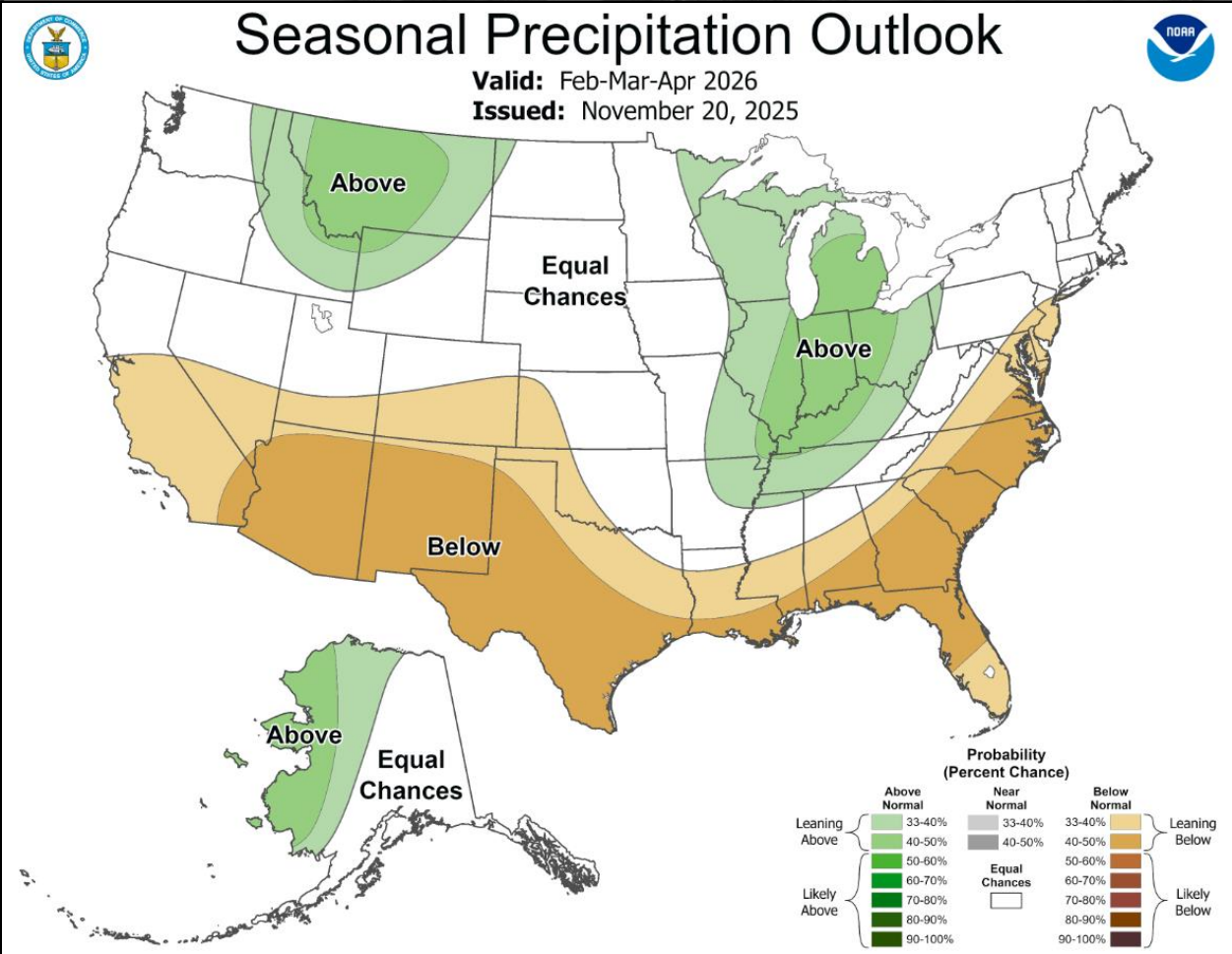

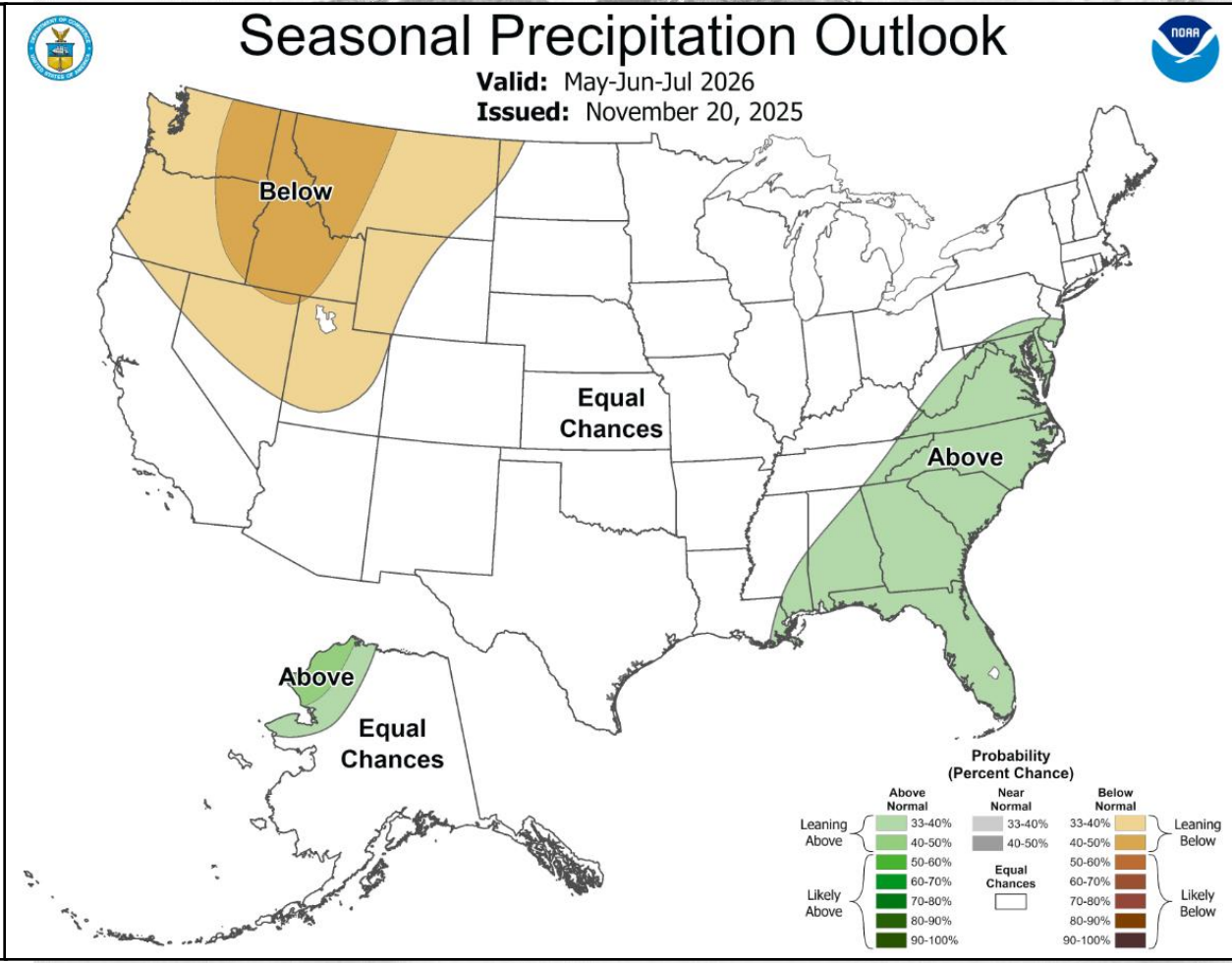
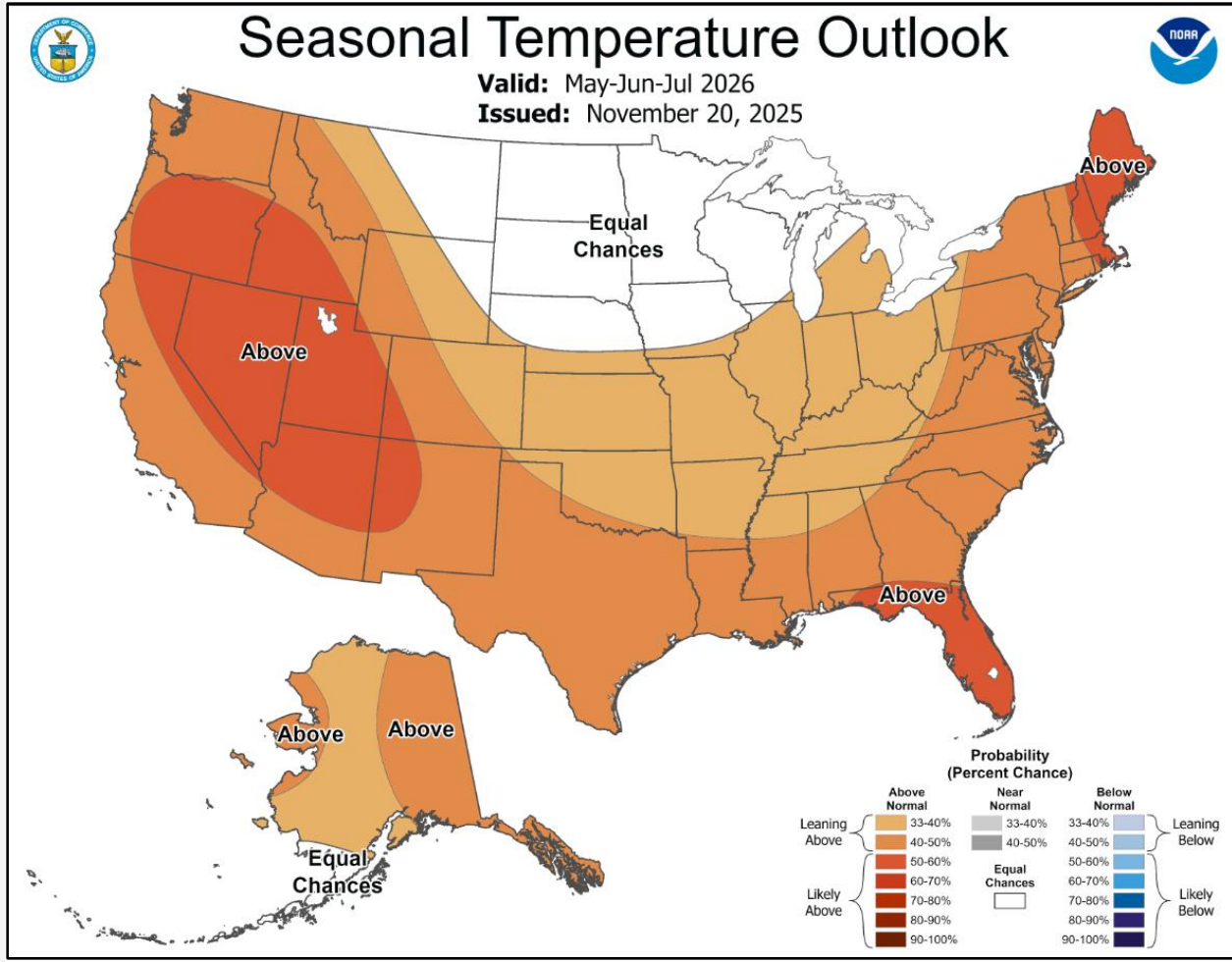


Seasonal Precipitation Outlook

based on $-0.5^{\circ}/+0.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ thresholds in ERSSTv5 Niño-3.4 index

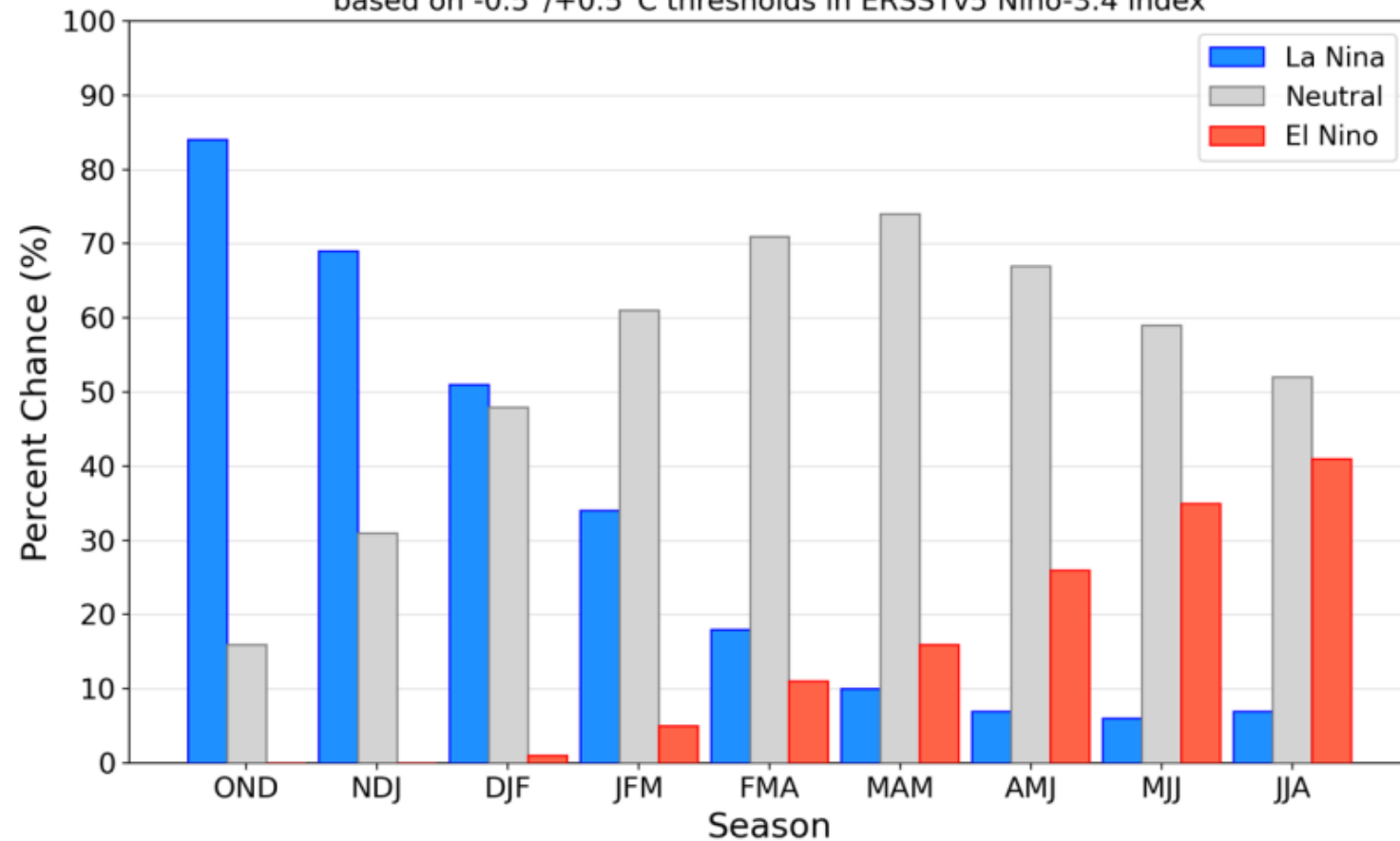
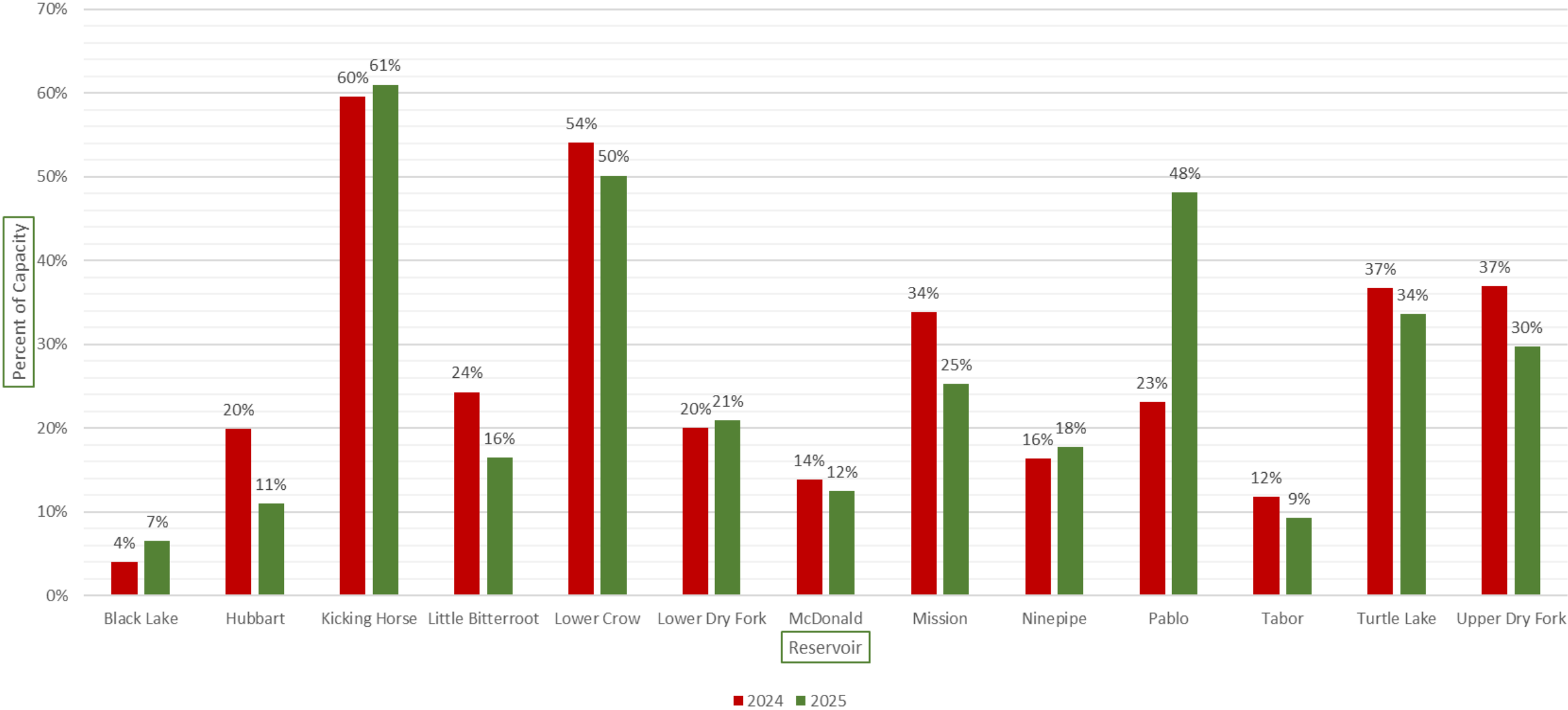
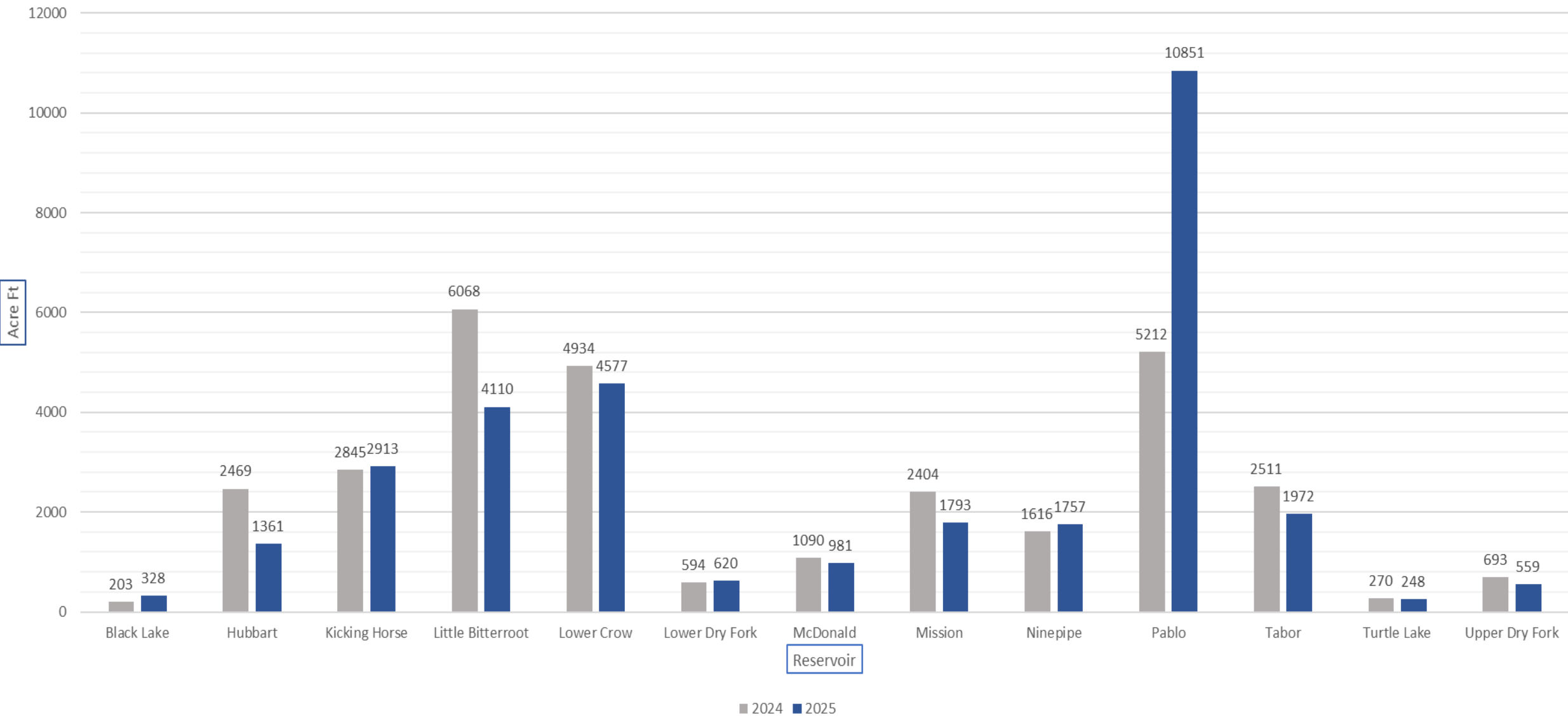


Figure 7. Official ENSO probabilities for the Niño 3.4 sea surface temperature index (5°N - 5°S , 120°W - 170°W). Figure updated 13 November 2025.

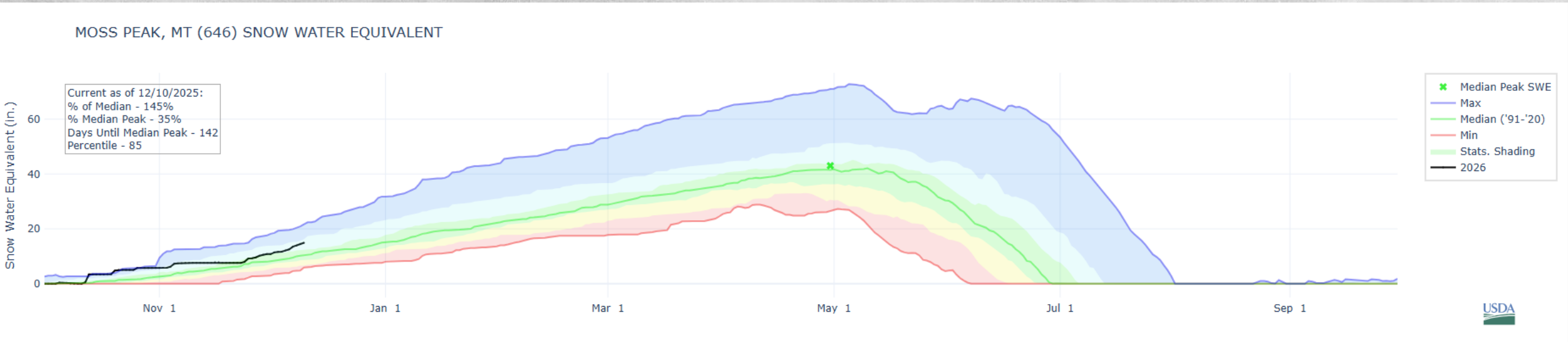
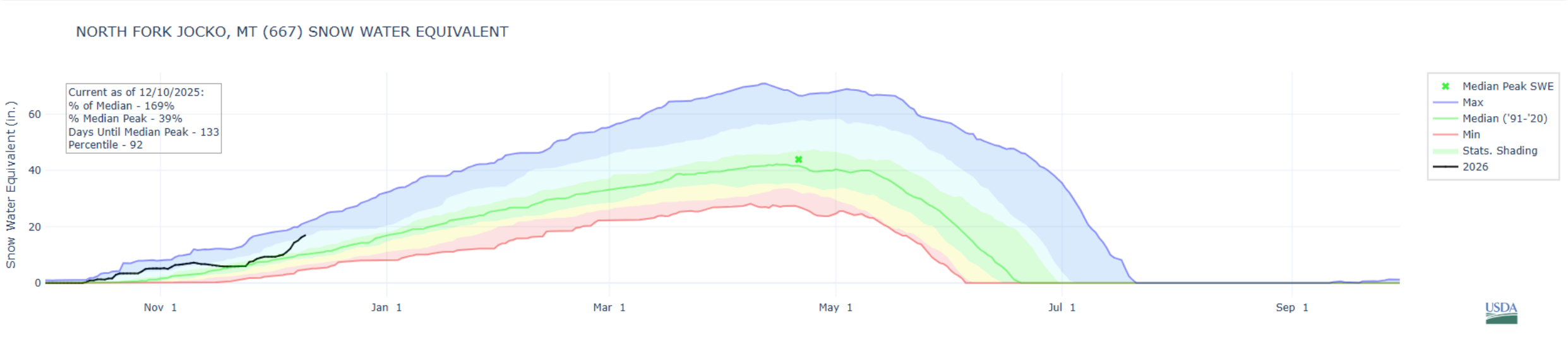
Reservoir Percent of Capacity December 10
