1. Planning grants

 The Department values place-based, integrated approaches to water supply planning. Through a collaborative planning process, planning groups should build upon existing knowledge, identify and fill information gaps, coordinate efforts, and explore innovative solutions to meet multiple needs. Effective planning can help places develop a shared understanding and vision, identify multi-benefit water projects, prioritize actions, and gather the support and resources they need to implement those actions.

2. Feasibility Study Grants

• Feasibility Study Grants fund qualifying costs of studies to evaluate the feasibility of developing water conservation, reuse, and storage projects. This competitive funding opportunity helps individuals and communities investigate whether a project is worth pursuing. Grants are offered on an annual basis, with applications due each fall. Grants require a 50% cost match of the total cost of the feasibility study, up to \$500,000. Any local government, Indian tribe, or person may apply for funding.

3. Water Project Grants and Loans

- This program provides grants for water projects to evaluate, plan, and develop instream and out-of-stream water projects that have <u>economic</u>, <u>environmental and social/cultural benefits</u>. Projects must provide benefits in each of these three categories to be eligible for funding.
- This competitive funding opportunity is meant for implementation-ready projects. Eligible projects include: conservation, reuse, above-ground storage, below-ground storage, streamflow protection or restoration, water distribution, conveyance or delivery systems, and other water resource development projects that result in economic, environmental, and social/cultural public benefits.
- Grants require a 25% cost match.
- Any local government, Indian tribe, or person may apply for funding.
- If an applicant or co-applicant is required to have a <u>Water Management and</u> <u>Conservation Plan</u> (WMCP), the plan must be submitted to the Water Resources Department and receive approval prior to the application due date.

This appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30, 2024.

The <u>Except as provided in subsection (b), the</u> commission shall submit a report to the legislature on each of the following studies prior to the 2021 legislative session:

(b) Funds not obligated prior to July 1, 2027, for the Little Wind River Storage Study, Phase II and the West Fork Reservoir, Phase III studies, shall revert to water development account III. The

commission shall submit a report to the legislature on each of these studies prior to the 2026 legislative session.

Section 7. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
