For applications received on or after January 1, 2024, you may object only to those issues on which a public comment was received (§85-2-308(1)(b), MCA). Refer to the Preliminary Determination for information about the issues on which the Department received a public comment.

If an Administrative Hearing is held on the application, you will be <u>limited to only those criteria</u> on which you specifically file an objection and to those objections that are deemed valid. For further information, see the Administrative Rules pertaining to filing a water right objection, ARM 36.12.117.
